All: In a dry and weary land where there is no water.


Leader: We have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and your glory.

Leader: We will bless you as long as we live, and in your name we will lift up our hands.


All: Our souls will be satisfied as with fat and rich food; and our mouths will praise you with joyful lips. -Psalm 63:1-5

Prayer of Confession

All: Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent, for the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Declaration of Absolution

Leader: The Lord is merciful and gracious,


Congregation: slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness.


