## Prelude


In Jewish culture, days begin in the evening with the setting of the sun. (We see this in Genesis 1 with the repetition of 'And there was evening and there was morning.') The day begins with rest. We start by settling down and going to sleep. This understanding of time is powerfully reorienting, even jarring, to those of us who measure our days by our own efforts and accomplishments. The Jewish day begins in seemingly accomplishing nothing at all. We begin by resting, drooling on our pillow, dropping off into helplessness. Eugene Peterson says, 'The Hebrew evening/morning sequence conditions us to the rhythms of grace. 

Leader: Our help is in the name of the Lord,


Congregation: the Maker of heaven and earth.

# Adult Education & Sunday School Classes
