## Sermon Discussion Questions | Leviticus 9:1-7. 22-24, 10:1-3

- 1. Leviticus is a continuation of the book of Exodus. What about Exodus tells us that the story of Israel's liberation is about more than being set free *from* slavery? What is Israel being set free *for* (cf. Ex. 5:1)?
- 2. The sacrifices that Aaron is to offer begin with a sin offering (Lev. 9:2), and much of the priestly system in Leviticus is about making atonement. How do you think about having confession in every worship service, every Lord's Prayer (forgive us our debts...)? What is encouraging to you about that, or what is hard?
- 3. What are your reactions to the death of Aaron's sons in 10:1-3?
- 4. Read Hebrews 7:23-28 (and, if you like, Hebrews 9:24-26). How do the priests and the sacrifices of Leviticus point past themselves to Jesus? Why was it necessary that there be another priest, Jesus, of a completely different order from Aaron and his sons?
- 5. Go back to the question about weekly confession. How does Jesus transform our confession of sin, and make it a different sort of thing from Aaron's sin offering?
- 6. Pray for yourselves and the church, that we would more deeply hunger and thirst after righteousness.
