Sermon Discussion Questions |Luke 6:46-49

1. In this part of the sermon Jesus says that people are calling him Lord but not acting as if he is Lord. What do these passages teach us about the Lordship of Jesus?

- a. John 13:12-20
- b. Romans 10:5-13
- c. Philippians 2:1-11
- d. Colossians 3:12-25

2. Jesus says that we acknowledge him as lord by doing what he says. What do these passages teach us about the word of God? (*note that "law," "commands," & "statutes" can all be used synonymously with "word.")

- a. Psalm 119:33-48
- b. Proverbs 3:3; 7:1-3
- c. Jeremiah 31:31-34
- d. Hebrews 4:1-13 (esp. vs. 12)

3. Share with each other instances when the "floods" Jesus describes (cf. Luke 6:48) have broken up against your "house." Did you find that the foundation you had built was able to withstand those events?

4. How is Jesus calling you to respond to him this week?
